

Election 2018 - What Happened?

Election 2018 was an historic event

 Progressive Conservatives win a majority government led by Doug Ford, bringing to an end 15 years of Liberal rule

 New Democratic Party forms the Official Opposition for the first time since 1987, led by Andrea Horwath



Ontario Liberal Party has its worst showing 160 years, losing official party status

Green Party of Ontario wins first seat in Ontario

Largest voter turnout since 1995


Ontario expands the number of ridings and MPPs to 124 from 107



• 73 of 124 MPPs are elected for the first time

ONTARIO'S VOTER TURNOUT







- Ran "populist" campaign "For the people"
- Former Toronto City Counselor & businessman






Andrea Horwath, MPP (Hamilton Centre)



- Leader of the Official Opposition
- Ran "populist" campaign "Change for the better"
- 3rd election as Leader of Ontario New Democratic Party





Kathleen Wynne, MPP (Don Valley West)



Engineers of Ontario

- 25th Premier of Ontario
- Ran campaign that was an extension of governing agenda
- Ontario Liberal Party has its worst showing in more than 160 years, losing official party status
- Resigned as leader, won riding by 200 votes

Mike Schreiner, MPP (Guelph)



- Leader of the Green Party of Ontario (GPO)
- First Green Party MPP in Ontario history
- "People Powered Change" campaign
- Active with the GPO since 2005



Ford Government Cabinet

 New governments tend to create cabinets that are smaller than their predecessor

Wynne cabinet at dissolution had 28 members responsible for 30 ministries and 6 non-portfolio responsibilities/secretariats

Cabinet making is a delicate process requiring balance and thoughtful consideration



 Ford cabinet can be expected to be 12-15 members, including leadership rivals, seasoned caucus members and newly elected MPPs

Progressive Conservative Agenda

Taxes

- Reduce income taxes by 20% for the second income tax bracket
- Reduce gasoline taxes by 10 cents per litre and diesel taxes by 10.3 cent per litre



 Lower business taxes from 11.5% to 10.5% and lower the Manufacturing and Processing rate by the same rate

Progressive Conservative Agenda cont'd

- Carbon Pricing:
 - Eliminate Ontario's cap-and-trade system
 - Challenge the Federal Government on any imposition of Carbon Taxation on to Ontario families




Progressive Conservative Agenda cont'd

Efficiencies

- Planning \$6 billion in efficiencies (4% reduction) without cutting jobs
 - 12% Reduction to Hydro Bills- Firing the "\$6 million man"
 - Ending Cap and Trade \$1.9 billion per year
 - 20% Middle Class Income Tax Cut \$2.26 billion per year, starting in year three.
 - Lower Gas Taxes by 10 Cents a Litre \$1.19 billion per year.
 - No Income Tax for Minimum Wage Workers \$558 million per year.




Ontario Provincial Election, 2018
